- ☐ GIST (Gwangju Institute of Science and Technology, President Kiseon Kim) signed a business agreement with KEPCO KDN (President Sung-chul Park) on November 24, 2020, to to train high-quality human resources and develop advanced technologies and industries.
 - The agreement ceremony was held on a small scale at the main GIST Administrative Building with GIST President Kiseon Kim and KEPCO KDN President Sung-chul Park along with key government officials.
- ☐ The agreement included provisions for: ▲ mutual personnel exchange to improve the quality of industry-academia cooperation education and research establishing a cooperative system of education and joint research for the development and innovation of high-tech technologies such as artificial intelligence (AI) ▲ seleting excellent students for awards and scholarships ▲ mutual cooperation on the shared interests of the two organizations.
 - Under this agreement, KEPCO KDN will select outstanding students from GIST and award them with scholarships and provide opportunities for job placement through regular job fairs.
- ☐ GIST President Kiseon Kim said, "Through this agreement with KEPCO KDN, which has advanced ICT energy technology, I hope that this agreement will create synergy in training specialists through joint research cooperation and innovative

education that will lead to the growth of high-tech advances in Gwangju and South Jeolla Province."
