GIST selected as K-digital business operating organization

- GIST (Gwangju Institute of Science and Technology) was selected as the operator of the K-Digital Platform, Training, and Credit projects organized by the Ministry of Employment and Labor in 2021.
 - GIST will expand its connections with various industries such as finance and blockchain to train digital convergence specialists.
- In 2021, K-Digital Platform, organized by the Ministry of Employment and Labor, is a project to support the establishment of digital new technology facilities for joint training centers, and GIST plans to provide customized education and support to local companies for five years.
 - K-Digital Training, Credit is a project to train workers with basic digital skills through innovative technologies and training methods. GIST will train 90 per year in business and 2,000 specialists a year through the credit business and provide internships and employment in connection with CJ OliveNetworks, Megazone Cloud, Dream Ace, and Artificial Intelligence Association.
