She has twice won the Simon Prize for Excellence, awarded by the university to a professor who has delivered excellent lectures in mathematics.

Jennifer E. Price, who wrote Chapters 7 and 12, is the daughter of Professor Dana Johnson. As a biologist who teaches college students, she has a lot of experience teaching students through online as well as traditional face-to-face lectures.

In Korea, where education is hot, many books are published to get into good universities. There are not many books on how to adapt to a foreign university environment after entering college. In particular, it is even rarer to find a book that contains sincere advice to students from the perspective of a professor in the same educational field.
