The signing ceremony was held on June 7th (Wednesday) at 11:00 am in the large meeting room on the 2nd floor of the GIST Administration Building, attended by key officials such as GIST Acting President Raekil Park, Dean of Academic Affairs Sang-Don Kim, General Affairs Director Seunghee Oh, and the National Intelligence Service branch manager.
