
GIST holds a classical music concert on the 29th to commemorate the 30th anniversary of its establishment... Invite locals to a free performance

The Gwangju Institute of Science and Technology (GIST, President Kichuk Lim) announced that it would hold a 'Concert with Local Residents' to commemorate the 30th anniversary of its establishment.

The first performance of this concert, consisting of a total of 3 concerts, will be held on August 29th (Tuesday) at 7:30pm. The GIST Oryong Hall 2nd floor Dasan Hall (535 seats) will be held under the theme of 'Environmental Concert — Green Land'.

On September 15th (Friday) and November 14th (Tuesday), performances on the themes of 'A Midsummer Night's Concert — Midsummer Nights' and 'Concert for Restoration and Consolation of Daily Life — Healing' will follow.

This concert will be held through the 2023 Gwangju Culture and Arts Donation Matching Support Project of Gwangju Metropolitan City and Gwangju Cultural Foundation. GIST announced that it was made possible by adding support from the Gwangju Cultural Foundation to the donations from the GIST Development Foundation.

President Kichul Lim said, "GIST, which has grown into a 30-year-old young person thanks to the interest and support of local residents in Gwangju and Jeonnam, has prepared a place to share the excitement of music. Please keep an eye on GIST, which is taking a step closer to local residents and growing with the region."

Chairman of the GIST Development Foundation Hae-myung Kim said, "Taking this concert as an opportunity, GIST will seek and support various ways to communicate with the region. The convergence of science and technology and industry and art, which GIST is focusing on, will lead to the production of various added values."

The string quartet 'Quartet Noi', which plays all of Antonio Vivaldi's 'Four Seasons' in its first performance on August 29th (Tuesday) at the GIST 30th anniversary concert, has been performing well with the audience through various stages and media since its establishment in 2019. Meanwhile, this concert is a free performance and can be entered without a separate ticket purchase or reservation procedure.
