He emphasized that in order for Korea to stand tall as a global pivotal country, a 'Game Changer*' is needed, and that scientific and technological innovation is a key variable in reorganizing the world order.

This means bringing about change and promoting improvement in various fields such as the environment, economy, technology, and society.

In addition, he noted that the global paradigm is changing from geography, politics, and economics to 'Techno-Politics' based on technology and politics.
