


▲ Poster for 'Poetry on the Canvas - Meeting with Jikheon Artist Heo Dal-jae'

Artist Heo Dal-jae is the grandson of the master of Korean Namjong literati painting, Uijae Heo Baek-ryeon, and is widely known as a representative artist of new Namjong painting that inherits tradition while adding a modern sensibility.

This event is an opportunity to deeply examine the artistic world of artist Heo Dal-jae, who combines the tradition of Namjong literati painting with a modern interpretation. You can have a special experience by listening to explanations of the works on display and directly sharing vivid stories about the artist's philosophy and creative process.

In addition, there will be time to deeply understand the unique charm of Shin Namjonghwa and the aesthetics of lines and blank spaces in oriental paintings, so it is expected to be a meaningful opportunity to feel how art permeates everyday life and moves us.

Namjonghwa is a branch of oriental painting, a style in which literati use ink and wash to emphasize the meaning of the painting. Shin Namjonghwa is attracting attention as a new trend that reinterprets this traditional technique with a modern visual language, and artist Heo Dal-jae has developed it into a unique artistic world.

Artist Heo Dal-jae, who is from Gwangju, learned calligraphy and painting from his grandfather, Heo Baekryeon, and has inherited the tradition of Namdo. He has been promoting the excellence of Korean art internationally by holding invitational exhibitions in New York and Paris since 1987, and recently received the honor of receiving the 66th March 1st Cultural Award.

GIST Academy Director Jae Gwan Kim said, "The meeting with artist Heo Dal-jae, who inherits and develops the tradition of Namjonghwa in a modern way, will add great meaning to the local art world. I expect this event to convey the value and depth of local culture and art and provide an opportunity to approach art in a more familiar way."
