
The committee reported the results of the 1st Integrity Improvement Special Committee meeting held on June 20 and the progress of integrity and anti-corruption work in 2024, and discussed measures to improve integrity.

This year's integrity and anti-corruption work reported includes: • Establishment of an integrity promotion system centered on management, • Expansion of integrity and ethics education, • Discovering integrity

promotion tasks through benchmarking of excellent organizations, \star Holding of integrity improvement working-level council, \star Integrity and anti-corruption campaign, \star Conducting meetings among members,

▲ Rewarding departments and research labs that contributed to integrity and anti-corruption improvement, ▲ Conducting a joint internal integrity survey of the four major science and technology institutes and deriving improvement measures.

On this day, President Kichul Lim said, "Various activities to improve integrity were promoted throughout this year, and since the actual evaluation is scheduled for next year, cooperation from related departments is absolutely necessary. In order to prevent omission of evaluation indicators, we will do our best to manage work, and in particular, we will ensure that there is no gap in handover due to the reorganization of the academic organization."

Planning Dean Hisam Kim said, "In promoting rewards for promoting integrity and anti-corruption work, we hope that you will give priority to faculty and department staff who are working hard on the front lines of research funding execution."

President of the Graduate School Student Council Tae-il Ha said, "In cases where the forms for research fund management are different for each department and department, there is also the burden of inquiring to the department and department office itself. If there is a common manual, it will be of great help in executing research funds."

Meanwhile, GIST will establish the "2025 Comprehensive Integrity Improvement Plan" based on the results of the Integrity Improvement Special Committee held this time, and plans to hold the "Integrity Improvement Special Committee," "Integrity Improvement Working Council," "Professor-Student Meeting," and "Integrity Citizen Auditor and Integrity Advisory Group Joint Meeting" next year to improve integrity.
