This lecture was designed to provide new perspectives and insights to citizens who love art as well as those who want to view the value of art from an investment perspective. It will cover a wide range of topics, from the deep pleasure of appreciating art to the economic value of art, and will introduce ways to enjoy art in everyday life and approach it as an investment.

* AiF children: A non-profit public interest foundation established to realize sharing and social virtuous cycles through art. It supports vulnerable groups and fosters cultural sensibilities in future generations by utilizing various art assets including art. In particular, it strives to expand the public nature and accessibility of art, and to make art a social asset that everyone can enjoy through art education for children and youth, fostering a culture of donation, exhibitions, and public interest programs.

Chairman Yun-seop Kim, who will gave the lecture, is an art critic who served as an adjunct professor at Sookmyung Women's University, an evaluator at the National Museum of Modern and Contemporary Art, a director of the Arts Management Support Center, and an appraiser for the Lee Kun-hee Collection.

In this lecture, he shares cases and insights that seek the intersection of business and art while looking at art in a new way from the perspective that "art is an object of appreciation and an asset that reads the times and the market."

It is expected to be a beneficial time for attendees from various backgrounds, such as the general public who wants to foster a sense of art, investors interested in the art market, and those working in the field of art management.
